• Human Values :-


Human values are the principles, standards, convictions and beliefs that the students to adopt as their guidelines in daily activities .

Principal human values are the foundation on which professional ethics are built. They are a set of consistent measures and behaviors that the students choose to practice in the pursuit of doing what is right or what is expected by the society. Most of the laws and legislations are shaped the human values.

The Concept of Human Right was First expressed in the Universal Declaration on Human Rights, was established in 1948 based on the principle “recognition of the inherent dignity and inalienable rights of all members of the human family.” The principles applicable to the students are as follows.

- 1) To respect the teachers and to the colleagues.
- 2) To attend the lecture regularly in college.
- 3) To pay attention to the class teaching and home assignments.
- 4) To maintain the self cleanliness and classrooms.
- 5) To maintain peace and discipline in the college premises.
- 6) To behave cheerfully obedient with their teacher..
- 7) To maintain good behavior in the institution.
- 8) The students voluntary donate their Blood to the needy peoples and/or Blood Bank.
- 9) The students should enroll their names to NSS programme and discharge to their duty honestly as part of their national commitment.
- 10) The students participate in the clinical Legal Aid and Awareness Programme..
- 11) The students should not involve any Anti National Activities
- 12) The students should respect Law and Orders.

Professional Ethics :-

The Professional Ethics consist of those fundamental values on which the profession has been built. Professional ethics is defined as “ the Personal and Corporate Rules that govern behavior within the context of a particular Profession”.

Legal Ethic is one of the professional Ethics which lay down certain duties for the observance to the members, which it owes to the Society, Court, Profession, Client and to Self.

Legal ethics is a term used to describe a code of conduct governing proper professional behavior which establishes the nature of obligations owed to individuals and to the society.

- 1) To endeavor to make the laws suitable to the well being of the Student.
- 2) To guard the liberty and freedom of the Student.
- 3) To protect the fundamental principles of Human Rights and respect the Constitution of the Nation.
- 4) To uphold the integrity and Unity of the Nation .
- 5) To respect the Law, the Courts and the sjudges .
- 6) To establish Legal Aid centre for the purpose of rendering legal assistance to the needy poor and deserving persons at free of any cost .
- 7) To help the people local bodies such as panchayat in the villages to function on sound lines so that the people may discharge their functions in an efficient manner.
- 8) To provide Legal Education to the illiterate and working people by informing them for the rights and legal provisions in simple language .
- 9) To work with the Social Welfare Committees to promote social order in which justice, political, economic and social values be restored.
- 10) To students always remain straight forward and his arguments should be pointed clear, precise and concise.
- 11) To have sense of humor and pleasing manners in his arguments.
- 12) An Advocate should not mislead the Court.

- 13) An advocate shall not influence the decision of the court by any illegal or improper Means.
- 14) To appear in the court at all times only in the prescribed dress. He shall not wear a band or gown in public places other than in Courts.
- 15) An advocate shall, when presenting his case and while otherwise acting before a court, conduct himself with dignity and self respect.
- 16) An advocate shall not criticize the Judiciary with malice .
- 17) An advocate should not act or plead in any matter in which he himself pecuniary interested .
- 18) An advocate shall not stand as a surety or certify the soundness of a surety for his client, required for the purpose of any legal proceedings.
